FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Spring 2018

It is almost time for all of our Camp Connections staff to arrive.... Wow! Time is ticking and we better get busy! This is what we have been up to over the last year.

The beginning of April we were busy prepping for Camp by interviewing and hiring staff for the summer.

In May, we brought Russell Pohl to Fort Smith for Beyond the Rainbow Crosswalk Tour. He did workshops in the schools in Fort Smith, Hay River and Yellowknife in partnership with FOXY. We also had a booth at the Trade Show in Yellowknife. The exposure was well received and we had many inquiries about fostering, adoption and Camp Connections.

In early June we were very happy to be the Charity of Choice for the Hub International Insurance Golf Tournament and were generously donated almost \$60,000 in cash and in-kind donations to go towards rebuilding the cookhouse.

Our Camp staff all started on June 19th and they will complete a week of training in the office and a week of prepping the programming and the camp itself. The first session of camp started at the beginning of July and went until the middle of August. We were able to accommodate 96 campers over the summer and this was the first summer that we were not evacuated due to wild fires. We had a canoe trip, even though it was shorter than usual because there were fires in the area. Camp programming was happy to have some of the regular artists attending at the request of the campers and some new ones that were very well received.

September was busy with prepping Camp Connections for the rebuild of the cookhouse. We had some amazing volunteers that spent a great deal of time working to remove everything from the cookhouse. We also did a great deal of fire smarting but removing any trees that were close to any of the cabins.

October brought the Canadian Foster Family Association Annual Conference in Whistler, BC. As always, there was a good representation from the Northwest Territories at the conference.



FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I continue with my position as secretary and Chris Dewolf took on the position of Chair. We have continued to work hard as a team with monthly conference calls and have completed our by-laws and policies manual.

Also, in October was National Foster Family Appreciation Week when we send out packages to all the foster parents across the territory and spent some time focusing on awareness and recruitment. There were some great celebrations in the communities to show how foster parents are appreciated.

I attended the National FASD Conference in Calgary, also had a face-to-face meeting with the CanFASD Research Network Family Advisory Committee. I have been on this committee couple of years. We have monthly conference calls throughout the rest of the year. This year we focused on a photo voice project about what it is like to be a caregiver of an individual with a diagnosis of FASD.

A new partnership with Kasteel Construction and Wilf's Renovations meant many meetings to discuss the rebuild of the cookhouse. By the end of October, the cookhouse was gone, thanks to the hard work of NWT Construction. There were meetings held throughout the winter and many more partnerships created. Thanks to T.A.G. we have beautiful drawings and construction started on May 20th. We will have a new cookhouse by the beginning of camp. Many other businesses and individuals have come on board to donate materials and time on this project and we are so very grateful.

In November, we launched a new series of adoption posters, highlighting different types of adoption. They were launched on social media and sent out to all the regions to hang up in the communities. We also set out booth up at the airport, chatting with people from across the NWT about adoption.

In November, we had Jody Robbiard join us in the office. She was trained to cover for Nicole as Nicole took 6 months off starting in January to travel. Nicole will be back for the start of Camp Connections.

We had another very successful stuffing party with many volunteers in December. We shipped out over 200 backpacks across the territory to be given to children and youth who come into foster care. The backpacks have items that provide comfort at the difficult time of transition. Funding for Ted and Loretta Rogers Transition Program is provided through the Children's Aid Foundation.

We sent out the first batch of Stay in School Awards in January and May. The response has been overwhelming and we had many new applications this year. If have a youth that is graduating from either grade 8 or grade 12, there are awards for them as well. Deadline is July 15/18. Check out our website for more details and for the fillable forms.

Registration is now open for *Camp Connections*. The registration forms are coming in at a steady pace so if you have someone that wants to attend camp make sure you get the registration form in as soon as possible. We are very happy to have Danielle returning as Camp Manager to lead our staff.

We have continued with our partnership with the Department of Health and Social Services over the past year, working together on projects that will benefit you and your families. They announced that the foster cares rates were changing as of April 1, 2018. It has been a long time since there has been a change to the rate structure. We look forward to continuing our work with the department and forming a new relationship with the Territorial Authority in the future.

I would like to thank the FFC Board for all their support over the past year, for their flexibility to support my family and me and to support the foster/adoptive families across the territory.

Note 1:

Foster care rates vary from community to community, based on the Consumer Price Index.

Note 2:

In addition to the basic foster care rate, supplementary payments based on the age of the child exist, such as:

- Age 0-5 years \$5.00 per day
- Age 6-12 years \$4.00 per day
- Age 13-18 years \$6.00 per day

And as required, a specialized needs assessment can be completed to determine if the child or youth also qualifies for additional funding due to a disability or a unique level of care need.

In October 2017, the CFFA Conference was hosted by the BC Federation of Foster Parent Associations (BCFFPA) who was celebrating their 50th Anniversary in beautiful Whistler, BC for an extended event.

This will be a week that has something for everyone; no matter the age, demographic or knowledge level, all coming together and "Shaking Hands in Greeting with each Other".

The week consisted of national and international attendance on the "how" to build right relationships on the journey of reconciliation between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples. It was "how" do we apply and act on the '94 Calls to Action' in today's reality. Our president Kevin Harris gave an all day workshop "Our Children, Our Future".

I attended this conference with Mary Bishop, Supervisor of Social Services, Fort Smith Region and I feel as a foster parent especially that of an Aboriginal child, this conference benefited me in my roles on the FFC-NWT and CFFA Boards. It was an excellent opportunity to network on behalf of these boards.

The Saskatchewan Foster Families Association (SFFA) will host the next CFFA Conference in June, in Saskatoon. I look forward to meeting others from the NWT that will be in attendance.
